GUSTAV NIEBAUM / THE PIONEER

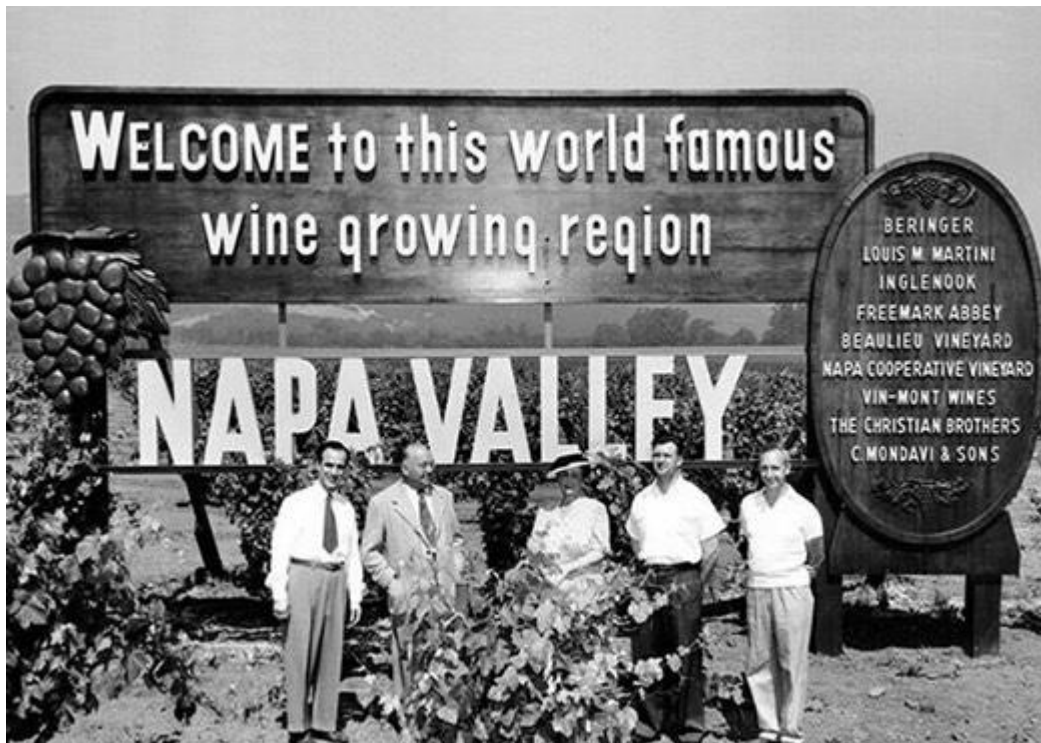
- Having built a fortune in the fur trade in Alaska, Niebaum seeks a new business venture. The wine connoisseur and visionary is drawn to the untapped potential of the Napa Valley.
- In 1879 he purchases the Inglenook property and plants 200 acres of vines with cuttings from Europe. He will produce the first estate-bottled Bordeaux-style wine in California.
- Niebaum pioneers planting blocks of vineyard with tight spacing, double sorting grapes at harvest, packaging in glass bottles and establishing a brand and a nationwide marketing organization.
- His motto of "Quality, not quantity" inspired new standards of excellence in California winemaking.

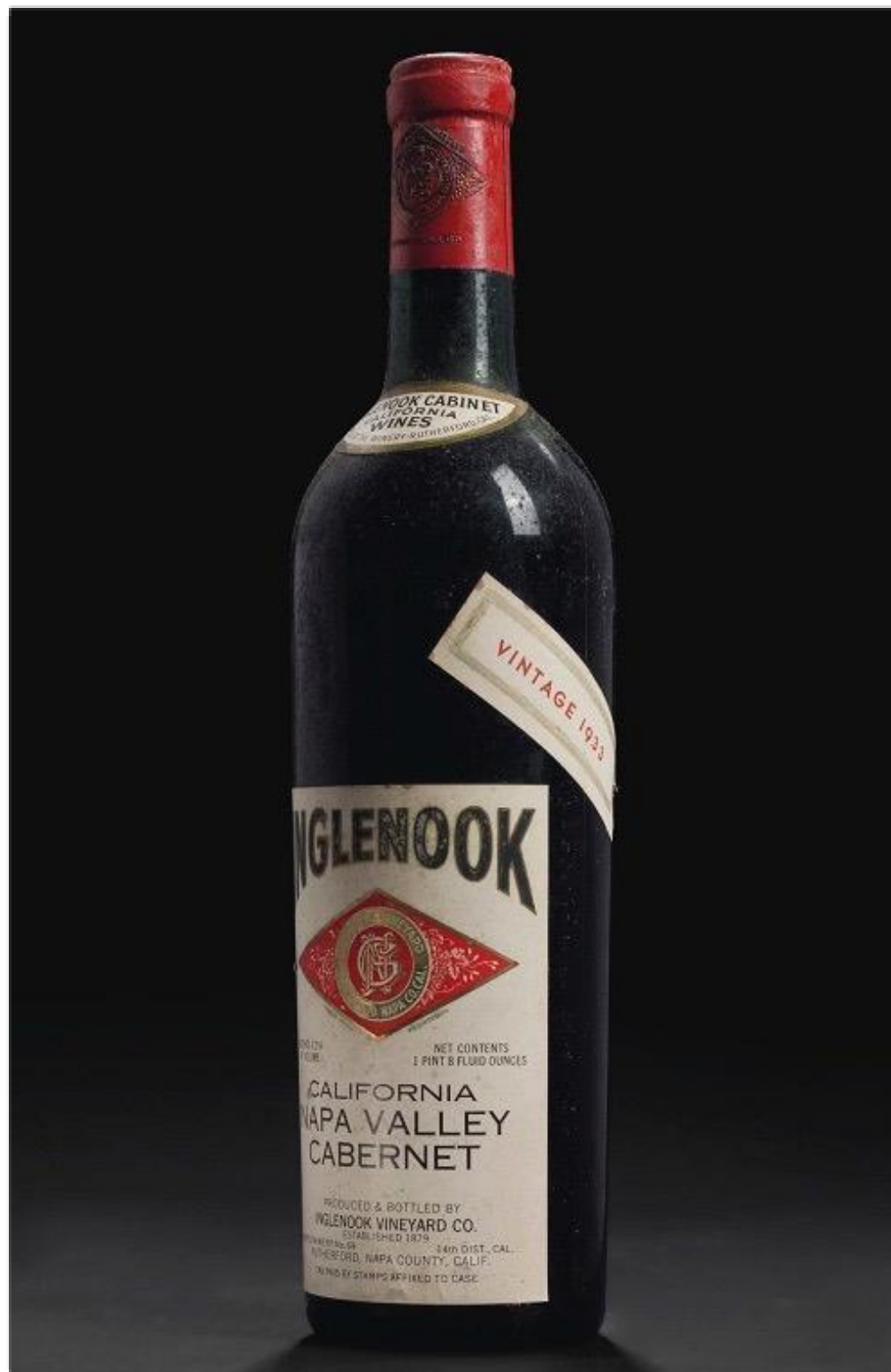




JOHN DANIEL, JR. / THE VISIONARY

- Great-nephew to Inglenook's founder Gustav Niebaum, John Daniel, Jr. is part of a small, dynamic group of vintners who rebuild the fine winemaking practices in California following the repeal of Prohibition in 1933.
- Both he and Robert Mondavi, his protégé, share the vision that Napa Valley can produce wine second to none. Daniel is a founding member of Wine Institute of California, the Napa Valley Vintners and State Wine Advisory Board.

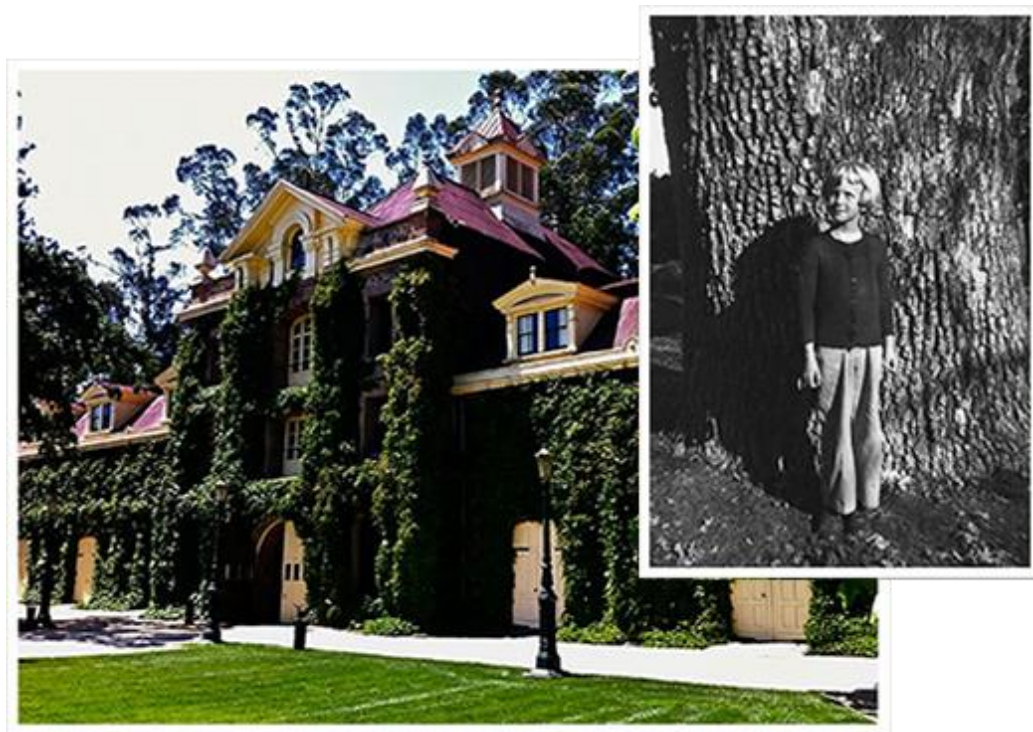




- Daniel is the first to put Napa Valley as an appellation on wine, and pioneers vintage-dating and varietal labeling.
- He makes the first Rosé in California.
- Daniel produces some of the world's best Cabernet Sauvignons from the mid-1930s to 1960s, creating a legacy of excellence for California.

ROBIN DANIEL LAIL

- Robin spends her childhood at Inglenook Vineyards, home to four generations of her family and their legendary wines.
- Due to financial strain, Inglenook was sold in 1964. Robin and her sister hold on to the Napanook Vineyard, a 130-acre parcel in Yountville.
- In 1977, Robert Mondavi, Daniel's protégé, hires Robin and becomes her mentor. He lectures her daily about her legacy and the importance of carrying on her father's work.

- In 1982, she cofounds Dominus Estate with her sister, Marcia, and Christian Moueix of Château Pétrus in Pomerol. In 1983 she cofounds Merryvale Vineyards with Bill Harlan, where she serves as president for a decade.

- As the sole 4th generation vintner in the area, Robin feels a responsibility to carry her legacy in California into the 21st Century. She establishes Lail Vineyards in 1995 with her two daughters Erin and Shannon.

WINEMAKERS – ATELIA MELKA

Philippe Melka ~ One of the most highly respected and successful of the French-born, Bordeaux-educated oenologists working in California, he founded Atelier Melka in 1995 and has been instrumental in crafting Lail Vineyards wines since the first vintage.




Maayan Koschitzky ~ Originally from Israel, he moved to Napa Valley in 2011 and worked with prestigious estates like Screaming Eagle and Dalla Valle. Koschitzky joined Atelier Melka in 2014, and now co-leads winemaking at Lail, bringing technical expertise and a deep understanding of terroir.



- Our vineyards are managed by Silverado Farming Company, the valley's leading farmer of premium acres, distinguishing themselves through high-touch, hand-tended viticulture.
- At Lail, the philosophy is that brilliant wines originate in the vineyards, but the brilliance is polished by the winemaker at two specific times – the decision of when to pick, and the making of the blend.

- Totem Vineyard in Yountville is on the site of the first vineyards planted in Napa Valley in 1839.
- The family has been dry farming this land for generations, since 1946.
- In 2006 the vines were T-budded to Sauvignon Blanc (from Merlot). These 3 acres produce the fruit for our highly acclaimed Georgia Sauvignon Blanc.

HOWELL MOUNTAIN MOLE HILL ESTATE VINEYARD



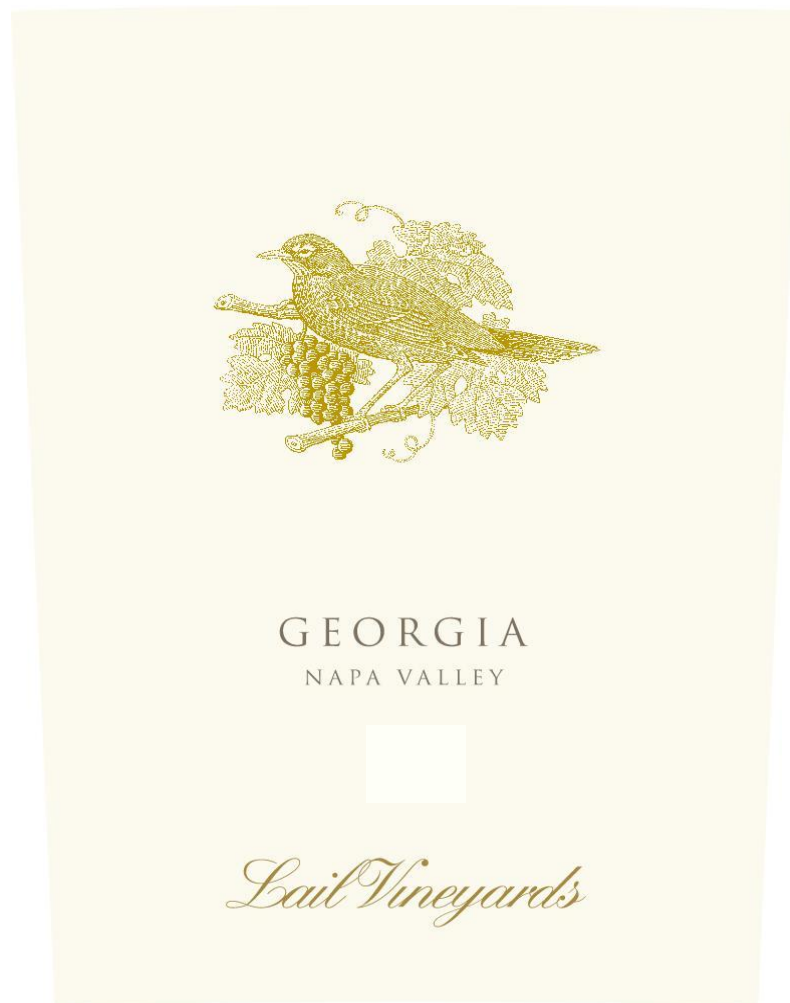


- In 1996, the Lail family acquired a special vineyard site high atop Howell Mountain where they still reside today.
- 3-acre, west facing vineyard, with shallow rocky volcanic soils.
- 1,700 ft above sea level, placing it above the fog line.
- Regeneratively farmed, emphasizing minimal intervention.
- 100% Cabernet Sauvignon.
- Each year, we harvest Mole Hill multiple times to capture the unique flavors expressed in each part of the vineyard.

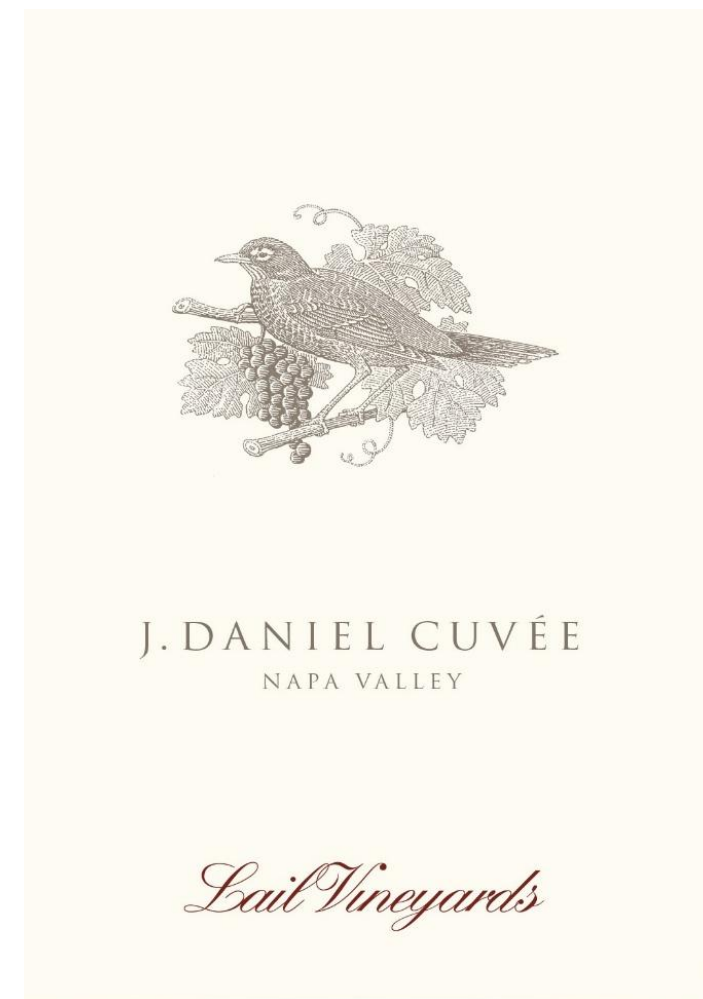


As of 2025, all of our bottles have been replaced with lighter glass, and we no longer use capsules.



Georgia Sauvignon Blanc is named after Robin's granddaughter, Georgia Eileen, and honors the 6th generation of the family's winemaking heritage. Georgia represents a New World expression of a Graves-style Sauvignon Blanc.

First American Sauvignon Blanc ever awarded 100 points by a leading wine critic.



J. Daniel Cuvée is inspired by Robin's father, John Daniel, a pioneering Napa Valley vintner. It serves as a tribute to his legacy of innovation and excellence in winemaking.

In 2025, Jeb Dunnuck named the 2021 the #1 Wine in the World.

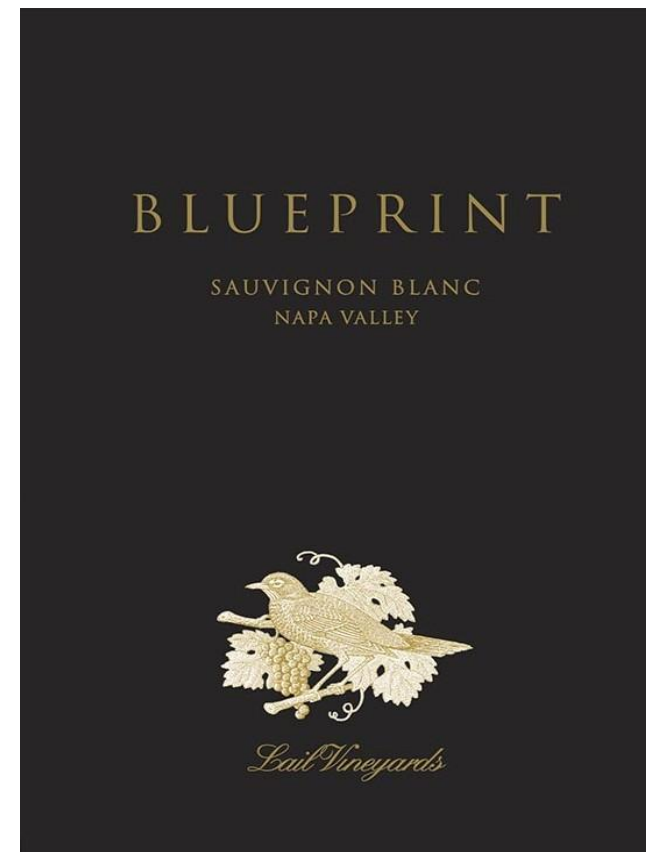
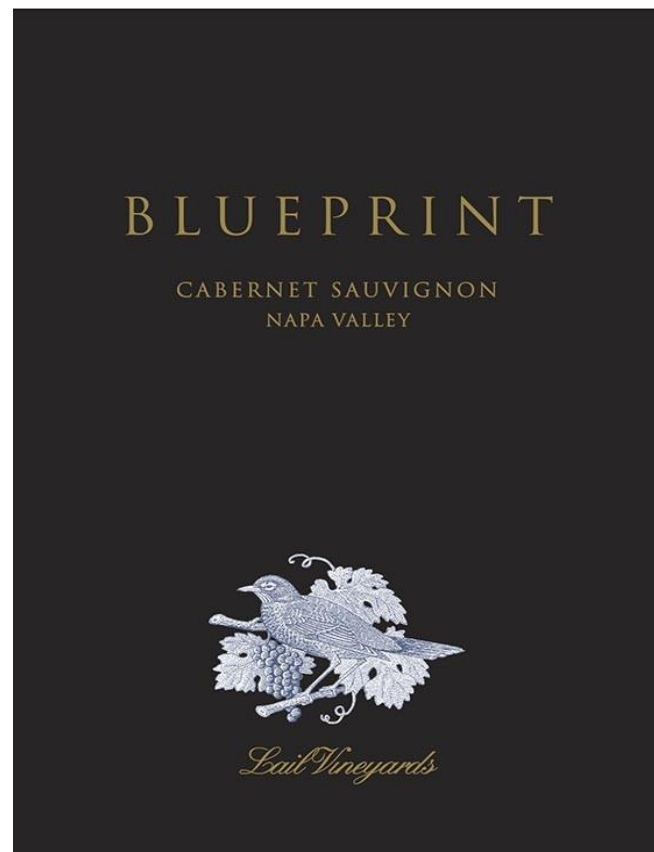


